Report on the Free Eye Check-Up Campaign (October 1, 2025)

This report documents the execution of the Free Eye Check-Up Campaign held on October 1, 2025, at the H.B.B.Ed. College, Vashi. The campaign was a collaborative effort by the Sainath Education Trust's H.B.B.Ed. College, the Community Corps of Rotary Club of Navi Mumbai Garima, and the Sainath Hindi High School and Junior College, in collaboration with PKC Hospital.

The primary objective was to provide free eye health services to the staff of the participating institutions. The campaign was a success, seeing an approximate total of 76 staff members receive check-ups. The event underscored the commitment of all collaborating entities to community well-being and preventative health.

The campaign was a product of collaboration between several key organizations:
